

Set priority goals based on alignment to other district initiatives. highest leverage actions, or other local factors. Agree upon how and when progress data for each goal will be collected and shared.

Reflect, Refine, and Redesign

Annually, the evaluation team reflects on progress toward priority goals. Those goals are refined or redesigned based on growth/gains. In some years the team may determine that systems have been established to support a new level of program implementation.
