Curriculum and Resources

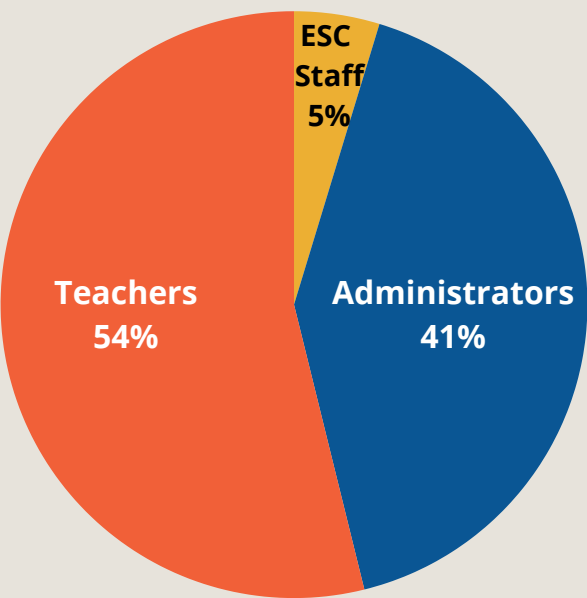
- Linguistically sustaining practices, curriculum, assessments, and resources aligned to program goals

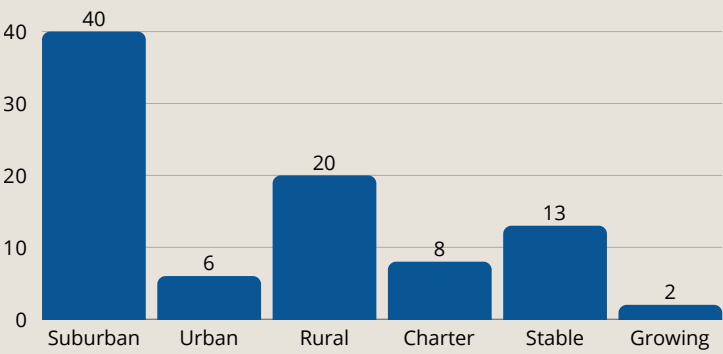
